SAFETY, SAFETY, SAFETY

- * This hobby can be enjoyable, however one must be safe while using tools.
- * Safety considerations include:
 - 1. Lungs Toxic paint fumes may cause a serious health concern if one does not protect themselves.
 - 2. Eyes & Hands Cutting, grinding, and just everyday use of tools and chemicals can cause injuries to the eyes and hands if we do not take the proper steps to protect ourselves.

How Much Should I Spend?

- * Whenever possible, purchase quality tools.
- * Quality tools tend to last longer and are less apt to break. **But they can break**
- * Start small then work your way up.
- * Add tools to your toolbox in gradually steps. You do not have to purchase all the tools at once.

- * Every model railroader should have a basic set of tools in their tool box.
- * The basic set of tools may vary from one person to the next.

- * Water based products are safer to use but safety measures should be taken as a precaution.
- * If possible make the switch to water based products. They produce high quality results and are safer to use.
